## THE MAJOR IN SOCIOLOGY

## General Requirements

The B.S. degree requires 45 semester hours. 30 s.h. in Sociology and 15 s.h. in math, statistics, and philosophy will prepare students for graduate school or careers in social science research.
A GPA of 2.0 in sociology courses is required of majors (you must meet this both with and without transfer credit). Transfer students must take at least 12 semester hours in sociology at The University of lowa.

## Course Sequence Requirements for the Bachelor of Science Degree

## A. Required Basic Courses, 12-13 s.h.

## B. Math, Statistics, and Philosophy coursework, 15 s.h.:
